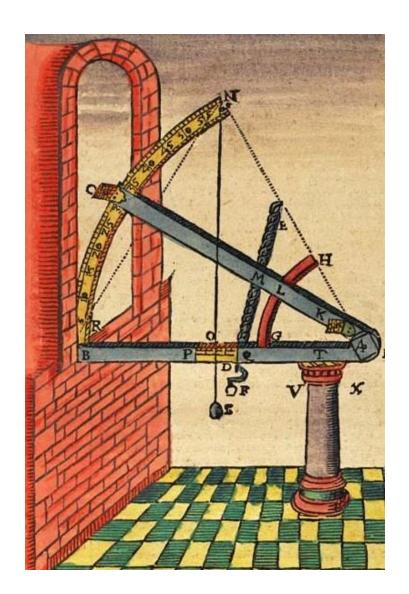

What is Science?

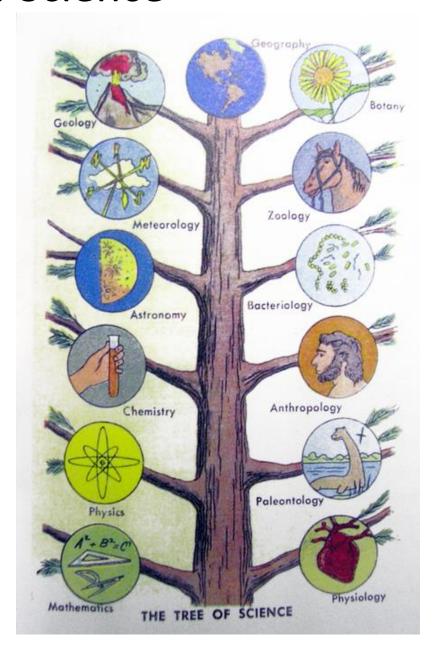
- (1) Science is the field of study concerned with discovering and describing the world around us by observing and experimenting.
- (2) Science helps us to know about things in nature
- (3) Science is a special way of doing things.
- (4) Science is a special way of obtaining information.
- (5) Science involves using certain skills and knowledge for solving problems.



Branches of Science

The Physical Sciences

- 1) Physics (The study of matter and energy and the interactions between them)
- **2)Chemistry** (The science that deals with the composition, properties, reactions of matter.)
- **3)Astronomy** (The study of the universe beyond the Earth's atmosphere.)



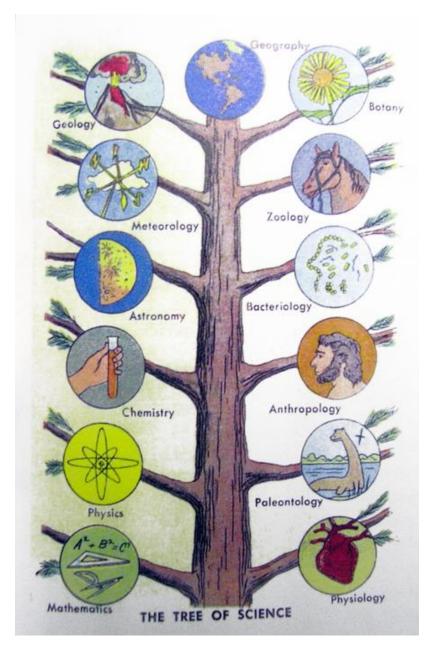
Branches of Science

■The Earth Sciences

- **1)Geology** (The science of the origin, history, and structure of the Earth)
- **2)Oceanography** (The exploration and study of the ocean.)
- **3)Paleontology** (The science of the forms of life that existed in prehistoric or geologic periods.)

■The Life sciences

- 1)Biology (The study of life)
 - **2)Botany** (The study of Plants)
 - **3)Zoology** (The study of Animals)

- Scientist are curious people who ask questions like

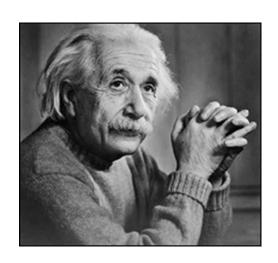

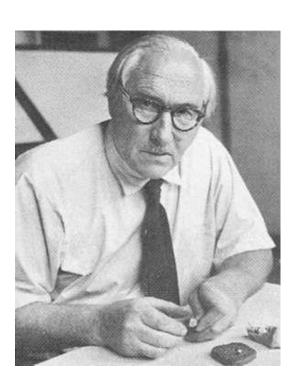

They are strong at communication, skepticism, truth and order.

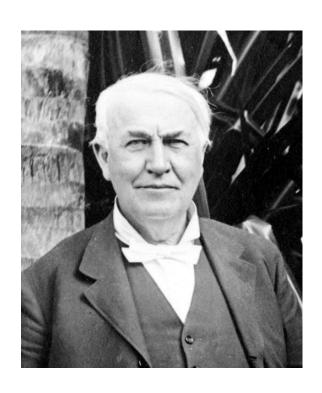

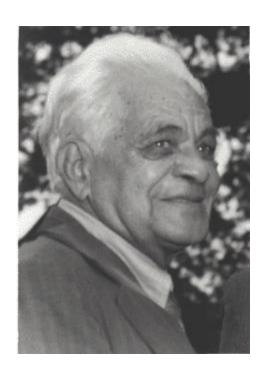

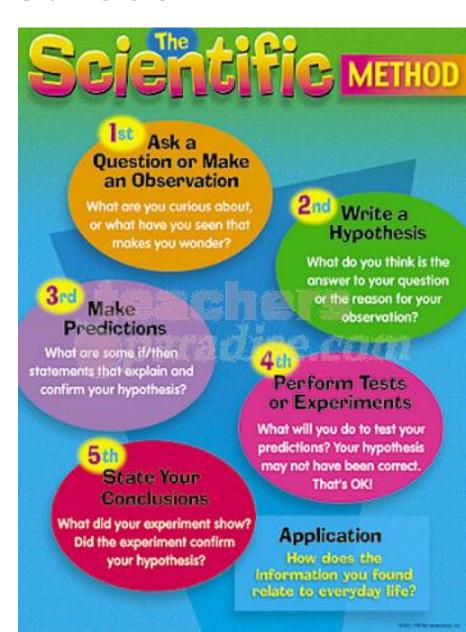

Scientific Methods

- It is a simple method scientists use to conduct an investigation.
- It is a way to ask & answer scientific questions & conducting experiments.



I. Question/Problem

- Ask a question about something observed.
 - Why?
 - How?
 - What?
- Question to be solved.
- Must be about something measurable.



II. Hypothesis

- Educated guess about how things work.
- Prediction
- Use If, then statements
 - If _____ [I do this], then _____ [this will happen]
- Focus on one variable only.



Predict the answer (hypothesize)

III. Experiment

Tests your hypothesis.

• Is it accepted (right) or rejected (wrong)?

Change only one variable at a time.

Use a control or control group

(A group that has nothing done to it. Standard used for comparison in an experiment.)

• In order for results to be valid, conduct several tests.

• Also collect data from experiments for further use.



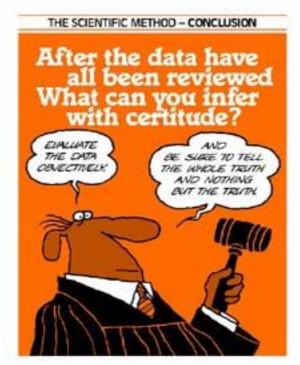
IV. Data Analysis

- Reduce the data
 - Average (Mean)
- Graph
 - Graph the data to look for trends & relationships.



V. Conclusion

- Summary of your experiment.
- After your experiment, analyze your data to see if your hypothes was accepted or rejected.



• If hypothesis is rejected, give possible reasons for the difference between your hypothesis and the experimental results.

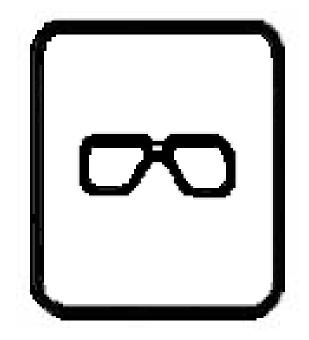
- General hazard warning

Goggle Use

- Wear goggles when using:
 - Chemicals
 - Sharp objects
 - Fire
- NON-NEGOTIABLE

Fire or Flammable

- Fire hazard
 - Use goggles
 - Tie back long hair
 - Tie back loose clothing

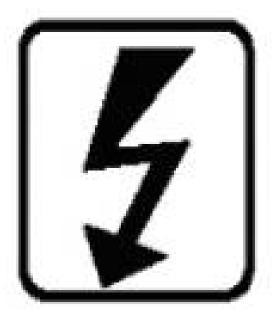






Electrical

- Electrical Hazard
 - Watch for water
 - Be aware of cords





Poison

- Poison Hazard
 - Wear goggles
 - Read label
 - Keep away from mouth





Corrosive

- Corrosive Hazard
 - Wear goggles
 - Read labels
 - Wear apron
 - Keep off skin







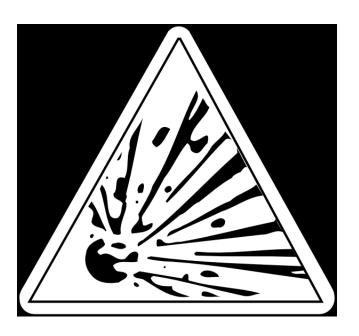
Explosive

- shatter

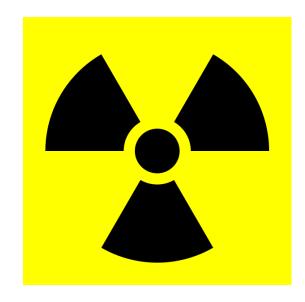




Radioactive

Safety Rules

Basic safety rules

- Do not enter the lab unless there is a qualified supervisor present.
- Always walk in the lab. Do not run or play around.
- Keep coats, bags and other belongings tidied away.
- Tie back long hair. Keep your hair well away from flames and hot objects.
- Nails should be neatly trimmed, and jewellery kept to the minimum earrings should be small and not dangling.
- The teacher, laboratory attendant and laboratory technicians are responsible for the equipment in the lab. Do not touch any piece of equipment, unless instructed to do so by one of these adults. Sometimes a senior student may be given the responsibility of guiding you and your classmates through an experiment. Obey all instructions given.
- Do not interfere with fittings such as gas taps and electrical sockets.
 Seek adult help if something goes wrong with any of these things.
- Do not touch electrical sockets or switches with wet hands. Never allow any electrical appliance to come into contact with water, unless it is designed to do so. You might get a shock.
- Do not open gas taps before you are ready to light the gas. A build-up of gas in the immediate area can lead to an explosion, and you can be seriously hurt.
